

Wyandotte County District Court new Case Management System

As of April 3, 2023, Wyandotte County District Court is now using the Kansas eCourt case management system.

Finding Court Case information

You can access information on specific district court cases in person by visiting the district court or online.

You can visit the Wyandotte County Courthouse and look up case information on the Public Access Computers. The computers are located on the mezzanine (m) floor.

You can also access information on specific court cases through Kansas's District Court Public Access Portal.

PLEASE NOTE: On-line searches will not provide case information on divorce, visitation, support, and paternity cases. Case information on those types of cases can only be obtained by visiting the local courthouses.

TOGA wallet accounts-Attorneys

To pay filing fees to courts operating on the Kansas eCourt case management system, you must set up a TOGA wallet account under your user profile in the [Kansas Courts eFiling system](#).

You must set up your account before you can begin to pay filing fees through the eFiling

system when you file in courts operating on the Kansas eCourt case management system.

Wyandotte County District Court will require a TOGA wallet account for eFiling payments beginning April 3.

Supreme Court Rules 20–25

Unless otherwise indicated, these rules apply to courts as they are brought onto the Kansas eCourt case management system. They require the filer to correctly designate the case and document type. They also require the filer to indicate if the document complies with Rule 24 protecting personally identifiable information or if it is filed under seal.

These rules are necessary to protect individuals' personally identifiable information as district court records are made accessible through the public access portal as part of the Kansas eCourt case management system.
